

JCIB Program

IB Diploma candidates must pass six (6) externally graded examinations in English, Calculus or Discrete Mathematics, Biology or Chemistry, a foreign language, History of the Americas, and a sixth IB course.

The JCIB diploma candidate must take a unique course called Theory of Knowledge, submit an extended essay of 4,000 words, and fulfill a prescribed number of hours in community service working with professionals in chosen fields. C.A.S. (Creativity, Action, and Service) is the requirement for the International Baccalaureate Diploma which includes community service. Students are not to be paid for their participation in the C.A.S program.

Students who fulfill the IB Diploma requirements will receive the IB Diploma in addition to the State Diploma. The requirements for the State Diploma are the same as the Advanced Academic Diploma with Distinction. **All JCIB students are required to work for the Advanced Academic Diploma with Distinction. Since our purpose is academic excellence, we prepare a student for college, and the highest diploma is needed.**

Approximately midway between each grading period, **progress reports** will be issued to all courses where a student has a "C" average or lower. Once a student is placed on academic probation, he/she must maintain a 2.5 GPA, or better, in all academic subjects. If he/she falls below the 2.5 GPA in **any** other grading period, **it may be recommended that the student return to their base school or seek another school setting.**
